1965 – Closest shop is No 47. This shop was built by Thomas & William Hutton in 1876 to make and retail shoes. It became a Grocery run by Pat O'Keefe then was owned by the Simpson family.

It became a second hand and new bookshop run by Madalyn Jones and Hazel O'Sullivan, from 1979 to 2001.



1970's - Hadrian Wine Store at No 61.
It was sold as a Wine Store shop to John Moorhouse in the 1980.
It was converted to a private house, Riverside Lodge in the 1990's.



1980's – Lithgow Sons & Partners at No 59.
This was an outlet for the Halifax Building Society.
The John Moorhouse Wine Store is on the right at No 61.
